<b>SCORE Element</b>	<b>Reflection Questions</b> <i>In what ways does the lesson...</i>
<b>Student-Centered Opportunities</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>● ask students to create a product that integrates or represents their learning in a unique way?</li><li>● ask students to share ideas and respond to the ideas of others?</li><li>● allow students to make choices about their learning environment (content, process, or product)?</li><li>● allow students to assess or critique their own work?</li></ul>
<b>Rigor Opportunities</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>● provide students with opportunities to develop and use higher-order thinking (HOT) skills (organizing, synthesizing, interpreting, integrating, evaluating)?</li><li>● use meaningful questions to guide student learning?</li><li>● ask students to construct a supported explanation or argument?</li><li>● ask students to negotiate a group understanding of a concept or idea?</li></ul>
<b>Relevant Opportunities</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>● allow students to make personal connections with the learning activities?</li><li>● address a topic or problem that has real-world implications?</li></ul>
<b>Engaging Opportunities</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>● place students in the role of active rather than passive learners?</li><li>● use formative assessment to link prior knowledge with new knowledge?</li></ul>
