

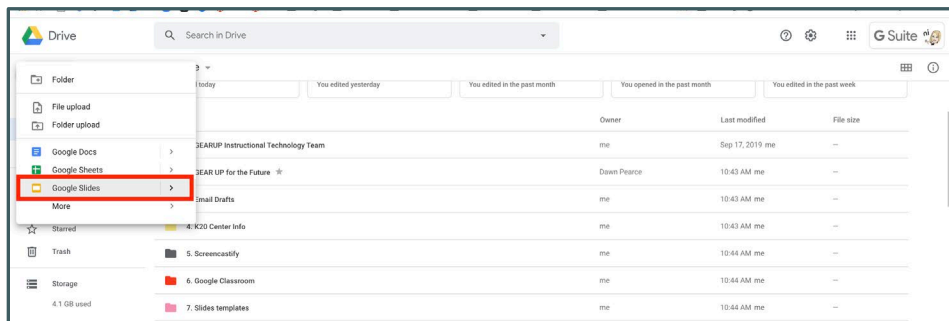
HOW TO CREATE A VISION BOARD

I. *Brainstorm*

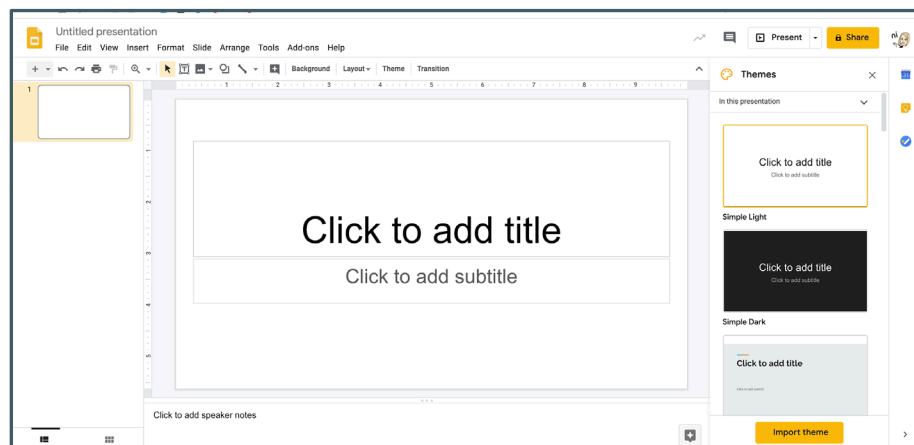
1. Think about the end of this school year. Where do you see yourself? What do you want your life to look like? How do you plan to get there?

II. *Create Your Board*

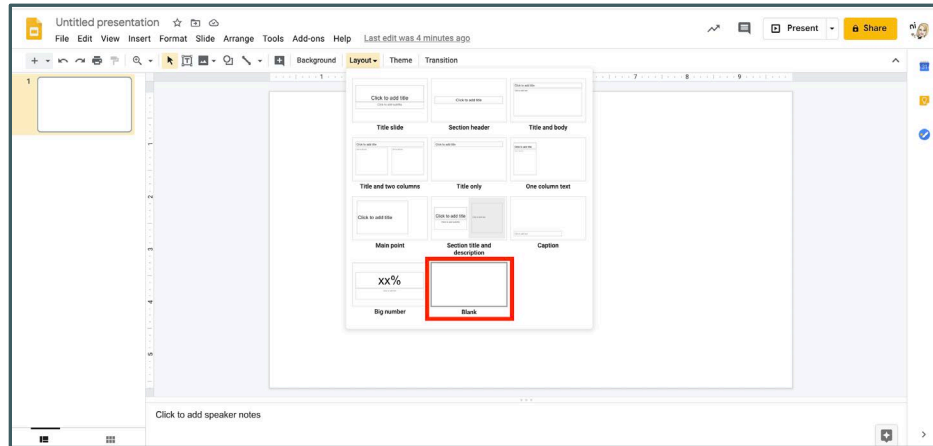
1. *Open Google Slides. Under “Start a new presentation,” select “Blank.”*



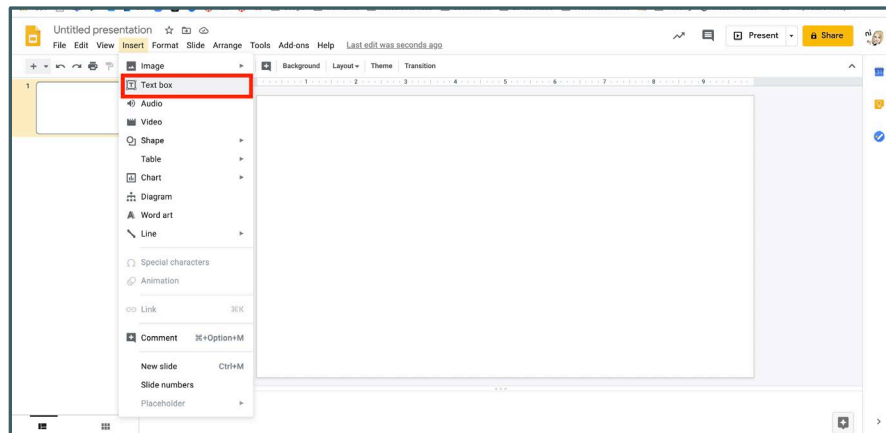
2. *Select a theme.*



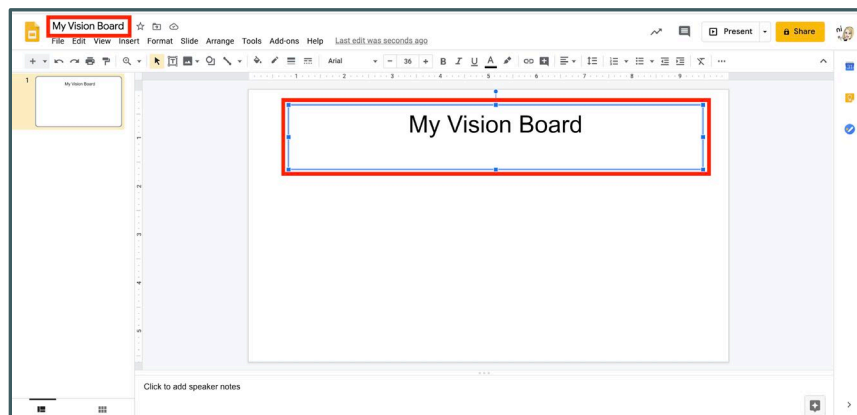
3. Change the background to the “Blank” background type.



4. Insert a text box. You will use this as your title box.



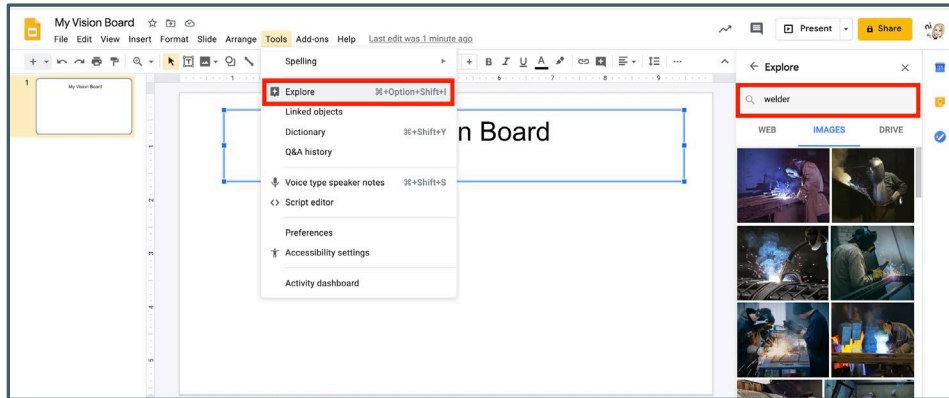
5. Title your vision board.



6. Go to File > Page setup. Select the “Custom” setting. Set your dimensions to 800 x 200 pixels.

7. Add images from Google:

- i. Go to Tools > Explore. Type in a word and select the “Images” tab to search for an image. Select an image and select “Insert.”

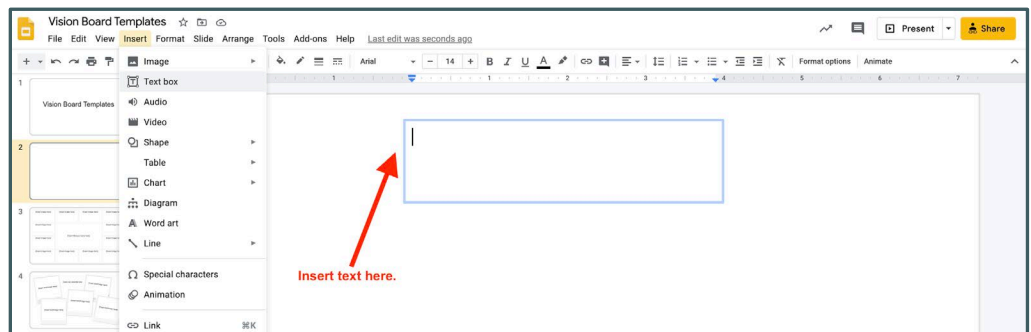


8. Add images from other sources:

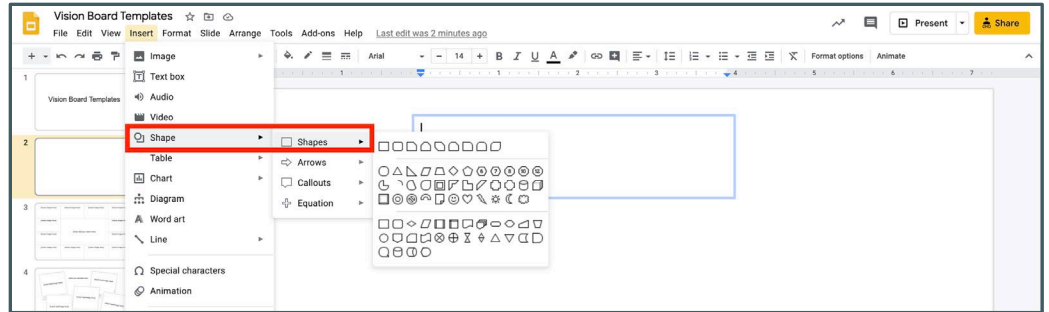
- i. Try navigating to a public domain photo source such as <https://unsplash.com/>. The pictures found here can be used without concern for copyright.
- ii. Save a picture to your computer, and add it to your vision board by going to Insert > Image > Upload from computer.

9. Add words, GIFs, lines, arrows, and more:

- i. Add more text: Go to Insert > Text Box to insert a box into which you can type text.



- ii. Add shapes and symbols: Go to Insert > Shapes to add shapes, arrows, speech bubbles, and symbols.



- iii. *Add lines: Go to Insert > Line, select your preferred line type, and draw it directly into your vision board.*
- iv. *Other features: Try out other features in the “Insert” tab to add audio clips, videos, charts, diagrams, and more.*

III. Create a Header for Google Classroom

1. *Complete your Google Slides vision board.*



2. *Go to File > Download and download your board as a JPEG or PNG to your device.*
3. *To upload your board image to your Google Classroom header, navigate to your Google Classroom. Select “Upload photo” near the current header, and select the vision board image from your device.*
